Outline	Torrential rain started drenching Manado, Sulawesi Island on 14 Jan. Landslides and flooding triggered by the rain left 19 dead and about 40,000 evacuated. A few days after the rain, Jakarta and surrounding areas suffered from major flooding. 23 people were killed and about 30,000 were evacuated.
