2014 (Jul-Dec) Major Water-Related Disasters in the World

France (Nov)
Continuous heavy rain
caused flash floods and
overflowed rivers. Death toll
was 5.

Sudan (Jul)
Continuous rain since
late July caused floods
in the capital, Khartoum
and other cities, raising
water level of the River
Nile. 77 people were
killed across Sudan.

India (Jul)
Monsoon rain triggered a
massive landslide, which
swallowed a village. 151
people were killed.

Nepal, India (Aug)
Continuous monsoon rain since Aug. 13 caused floods and landslides across Nepal and also in northern India. 123 people in Nepal, and 155 in India were killed.

India (Sep)
In India's northeastern
provinces of Assam and
Meghalaya, a few
consecutive days of heavy
rain caused floods and
landslides, claiming 95 lives.

India, Nepal (Oct)
On 12, Tropical Cyclone
Hudhud made landfall on the
southeastern part of India,
causing huge damages to the
power supply, buildings and
agricultural produce. In Nepal,
the cyclone triggered blizzard
and avalanche. 81 people in
India, and 43 in Nepal were
killed.

Nepal (Aug)
A massive landslide was caused by heavy rains, which engulfed houses, markets, and part of highway. Also, the landslide blocked Sunkoshi River, forming a 3 km-long artificial lake. Death toll was 156.

South Korea (Aug)
As much as 130 mm of rain that fell in just 1 hour, in southeastern parts of the country, affected infrastructures, suspending subway service and blocking roads. The Gori-2 nuclear plant was manually shut down. Death toll was 10.

Brazil (2013~)

The southeastern part of Brazil experienced the worst drought in 80 years. Reserves in the reservoir system that fell to record low affected lives of citizens, restricting water use. Agricultural produce is also damaged.

Sri Lanka (Oct)
On Oct. 29, several
consecutive weeks of heavy
rain triggered a massive
landslide. 13 people were killed.

India, Pakistan (Sep)
Continuous rain since Sep 2
triggered floods and landslides
in Jammu and Kashmir,
northernmost province in India,
and in Punjab and AJK
provinces in Pakistan. 281
people in India and 367 in
Pakistan were killed.

Indonesia (Dec)
On the night of 12, monsoon rain caused a landslide in the village of Jemblung, Central Java. 95 people were killed.

Philippines (Dec)
Typhoon Hagupit made landfall in Samar Island on Dec. 6.
One of the world's biggest evacuation was taken place and more than 1.8 million people were sheltered at most. Death toll was 18.

Philippines, China (Jul)
Typhoon Rammasun that landed
on the eastern part of Philippines
on 15 Jul, moved across Luzon
Island and made final landfall in
southern China. Rammasun was
the most powerful typhoon that
hit southern China in 40 years.
106 people in Philippines, and 62
in China were killed.

Philippines (Dec)
Tropical storm Jangmi made
landfall on Hinatuan, Surigao del
Sur, which caused floods and
landslides in many parts of the
country. Death toll was 66.
